Exhibitor Information

1. All entries must be submitted on an Entry Form (found at the end of the schedule) on Friday 25th August between 6:30pm and 8:30pm or Saturday 26th August between 8am and 9:30am at Ballantrae Community Centre.
2. When you hand in your entry form you will be given a staging card for each entry you listed on your entry form.
3. There is no entry fee for any class.
4. A maximum of 2 entries per person per class is allowed.
5. No names to be visible on any entry please.
6. All exhibits in the Vegetable and Flower classes must have been grown by the exhibitor.
7. Exhibits in all other sections must have been made by the exhibitor.
8. For entries in the Flower Section exhibitors must provide their own bowls but vases are supplied and must be used.
9. Paper plates are provided to stage entries in the Vegetable Section where applicable.
10. Paper plates and doilies are provided for entries in the Baking Section and must be used.
11. The hall will be open on the eve of the show from 6:30pm to 8:30pm and from 8am to 9:45am on the morning of the show. Stewards will be available to assist with staging of entries and to answer any questions you may have.
Please allow plenty of time to stage your entries.
12. Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring staging cards are correctly written and placed. Please complete the front of each staging card with your name and class number and also write only the class number on the back of the card. The staging card should then be placed face down under your entry so that only the class number is showing.
13. All exhibits must be staged by 9:45am on the morning of the show.
14. All persons other than stewards MUST vacate the hall by 9:45am and judging will begin at 10am.
15. Exhibits to remain on show until 3:45pm
16. The Committee reserve the right to refuse any entry. The judges' decision is final.
17. The Treasurer will distribute prize money from 3.45pm. The show will close at 4pm.
