South Ayrshire Council (SAC) Budget Cuts: Over 90 villagers and representatives of other nearby communities attended the Ballantrae Community Council (BCC) meeting on 29 March when Dr Claire Monaghan, Head of Communities at SAC explained the background to the decisions regarding charging for the stalls for the Gala Day and electricity and heating oil consumed in the hall. We are delighted to report that Ayrshire Leader have agreed to underwrite most of the costs related to the Gala stalls for 2016 but, as we go to print we understand that discussions are continuing about electricity and oil charges.
