The Smugglers are coming!

This year's Ballantrae Smugglers' Festival started in June. We launched the children's book "Our Smuggling Tales", we've published the 4 Smugglers Walking Trails (copies in



Craigiemains), we've piloted a Smugglers' Road Trip around Scotland phase 1 Stranraer to Girvan, and mounted the Smugglers! exhibition in the McKechnie Institute in Girvan. We are now planning 4 events in Ballantrae in August:

At 7.45pm on Friday 5 August: "The Landing of the Contraband" at the Harbour with the tall ship La Malouine, skiffs, Smugglers, Excisemen and the Militia, and horses all re-enacting the Ballantrae Smuggling story. The event is FREE. The action starts at the harbour and ends at Craigiemains. ITV are planning to film the landing and La Malouine's role in it so you could see yourself on TV! Come to the harbour and enter the FREE prize draw for a bottle of contraband whisky!"

At 6.30pm on Saturday 6 August the popular "Strongman Challenge" in the Recreation Ground with teams of 2 from the village and surrounding communities. There will be 2 competitions - one for adults and one for children.

At 7.30pm on Saturday 13 August in the King's Arms Hotel, a Smugglers' Supper with good food and musical entertainment. Tickets will be available from the Kings Arms Hotel.

At 2pm on Sunday 14 August at the harbour "The Smugglers' Chase" (skiff racing) involving boats from Ayrshire and beyond. The teams will be competing for the trophy crafted by John McIlwraith
