Groups bidding for a share each make a 3 minute pitch to the audience of local people who vote. After the votes are counted the money is given to those with the highest number of votes. As we go to press, Ballantrae groups are currently deciding which projects to put forward but we'll be there pitching! Please look out for more details and come and support them.

The Future of Ballantrae Development Group

IN A NUTSHELL:

Ballantrae Development Group is the sub-group of the Ballantrae Community Council that has initiated such events as the Smugglers' Festival and the Food & Drink Festival. It has come to light that, due to the informal nature of the sub-group, the BCC members would be personally liable for any financial loss from activities, which is clearly not acceptable. It is therefore ESSENTIAL that this situation is corrected before the 2017 festival season starts. Furthermore, being a Trust would help us access the grant funding for such large projects as the Play Park improvements.

AND NOW, IN MORE DETAIL (as submitted to the BCC meeting in November 2016):

The Future of Ballantrae Development Group

The BDG has existed for almost 6 years as a subgroup of the Ballantrae Community Council (BCC). Grant funders tell us that the BDG's activities have "approached a scale that is no longer appropriate for a Community Council to be responsible for". Community Councils are statutory bodies, meaning that in the event of dissolution, their assets revert to the local authority. Community Councils are unincorporated, which means that individual office bearers hold personal and unlimited liability for activities. Grant funders therefore advise that the BDG needs to move to become a separately constituted, incorporated organisation, e.g. a Trust.

This will be particularly important as the village starts to tackle some of the larger investment and challenging projects in the Village Development

Plan including the re-vamping of the play park and the Recreation Ground, continuing to develop the Smugglers' Festival and the have established similar organisations" Festival of Food and Drink - all within an environment of continu-

ing local authority and national budget cuts.

This is not breaking new ground. Other communities across Scotland have established similar organisations and we shall be learning from their experiences. For example, while the BCC and a Trust will be separate bodies with their own responsibilities, it's really important that the Community Council and the Trust complement each other and have a shared vision of the future of the village. It will also be important to ensure broad representation on the Trust's governing body of BCC members, local groups, and individuals, to manage the Trust's affairs on behalf of all of Ballantrae. Advice will be sought from the Development Trust Association Scotland on how best to achieve this.

Initial research shows that Development Trusts are community organisations which typically:

- are owned and managed by the local community
- aim to ensure the sustainable regeneration of a community or address a range of issues within that community
- are independent but seek to work in partnership with others in the private, public and third sectors
- aim to reduce dependency on grant support by generating income through enterprise and the ownership of assets. All trading surpluses are reinvested in the organisation or the community.

"this is not breaking new ground. Other communities across Scotland Therefore it is proposed to start detailed discussions with the **Development Trust Association** Scotland about setting up a Ballantrae Trust.

The Community Council will continue and the village will be informed of progress at BCC meetings and through the Ballantrae News (the next edition is due out in January).
