# BALLANTRAE Ballantrae Trust AGM and "What Next?"

The first Trust AGM was held on 1 May. Around 30 people attended and eleven Directors were voted on to the new Trust Board: Alan and Carol Bell, Jessie Brown, Dan Cunningham, Gavin Fairbairn, Siobhan Liddington, Andy McAlpine, Aylie McIlwraith, John McIlwraith, Mhairi McKenna and Claire Mills. Resolutions were submitted and passed removing the one-off membership subscription of £2, increasing the number of Ordinary member Directors to 11 and the minimum to 5. At the first Board meeting held on 3 May Andy McAlpine was elected Trust Board Chair with John McIlwraith as Treasurer.

One of the major items on the agenda of the Board meeting on 18 June will be an update on the many projects the Trust has inherited from the Ballantrae Development Group which the Trust has replaced. The Board is already considering what it needs to do for the Festival of Food and Drink to return in 2019. Work continues on the planning for the upgrading of the Play Park with funding now standing at around £20,400. A report on the Year of Young People Easter 2018 programme has now been produced and copies are available from Andy McAlpine. Planning has started for a Summer Holiday Activity programme as part of the Year of Young People 2018 project. The gardening club is a very informal group whose aim is to encourage more people to


green spaces. We are lucky, as a club, to visit gardens which are not always open to the public, so please join us if you can.
